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End Calls	Touch MFB to end the call	"On"
Search on Earphone & Phone	During a call, press and hold the MFB for 2 seconds, you can use a prompt tone to search for the call you want to answer (the call can talk on headset)	"On"
Call Mute	During a call, double click the MFB, you can hear a prompt tone that means you realize it can mute function.(Repeat this action 3 times can cancel the mute function)	"On" & "at once"
Volume Control	Click "Up" or "down"	"Maximum volume" & "Minimum volume"
Previous Song	Press "Vols" for 1 second, then press the MFB	"no prompt"
Next Song	Press "Vols" for 1 second, then press the MFB	"no prompt"
Play/Pause	Touch MFB	"no prompt"
Redial	Double click the MFB	"New line & number ready"
Repeat the third-party incoming call	During a call, double click the MFB, you can hear a prompt tone that means you reject the third-party incoming call and continue to talk	"On"
End Answer	During a call, click the MFB, you can hear a prompt tone that means you answer the third-party incoming call and end the current call	"On"
Hold & Answer	During a call, long press MFB, you can hear a prompt tone that means you answer the third-party incoming call and hold the current call (Repeat this action can switch the call)	"On"
