

1.IMPORTANT SAFETY INFORMATION

WARNING: Any use of this appliance other than that recommended by the manufacturer in this owners manual may cause fire, burns, electric shock and/or other serious injuries or death.

When using electrical appliance, basic precautions should always be followed to avoid the risk of fire, electric shock and injury to persons including the following:

- 1. Read all instructions before using this appliance.
- 2. This appliance is hot when in use. To avoid burns, do not let bare skin touch hot surface. If provided, use handles when moving this appliance. Keep combustible materials, such as furniture, pillows, bedding, papers, clothes, and curtains, etc. at least 3 feet (0.9 meter) away from the front of the appliance. Keep all items away from the sides and rear.
- **3.** Extreme caution is necessary when the appliance is used by or near children or invalids and whenever the appliance is left operating and unattended.
- 4. Always unplug appliance when not in use. This unit should be operate under supervision and should not be left on without supervision.
- **5.** Do not operate any appliance with a damaged cord or plug or after the appliance malfunctions, has been dropped or damaged in any manner. Return appliance to authorized service facility for examination, electrical or mechanical adjustment or repair.
- **6.** Do not use outdoors.
- **7.** This appliance is not intended for use in bathrooms, laundry areas and similar indoor locations. Never locate appliance where it may fall into a bathtub or other water container.
- **8.** Do not run cord under carpeting. Do not cover the power cord with throw rugs, runners, or similar floor coverings. Arrange cord away from traffic area and where it will not be tripped over.

However, If an extension cord MUST be used, the cord must be No. 14AWG minimum size and rated not less than 1875 Watts. The extension cord must be a 3-prong cord with grounding type plug and cord connection and should not exceed 20' (6m) in length.
- **17.** When transporting or storing the appliance, keep both the unit and power cord / plug dry, free from excessive vibration and away from heat sources to avoid causing fire, electric shock, or injury to persons.
- **18.** Do not attempt to burn wood or other materials in this appliance.
- 19. This appliance, when installed must be electrically grounded in accordance with the current.







Locating the Appliance

Your new electric fireplace may be installed virtually anywhere in your home. However, when choosing a location, ensure that the general instructions for safety are followed.




- For best results, install out of direct sunlight, water or very damp air.
- Power supply service must be installed within proximity of electric fireplace prior to finishing avoiding reconstruction.
- Try to avoid any conditions that may cause the fireplace to vibrate, which would result in the automatically turning on or off of the fireplace itself.
- Due to many different finish materials use on walls, it is highly recommended that you consult your local builder before you install this fireplace in the wall.

Minimum Clearance to Combustibles

Sides......0 inch
Floor......0 inch
Back.....0 inch
Top (Mantel or TV).....8 inch min
Front.....36 inch

WARNING! Risk of Fire!

Keep electrical cords, drapery, furnishings or other combustibles at least 3ft. (0.9 m) from the front of the electric fireplace.



Electrical Supply Circuit Requirements

Plan the location of the appliance so that it will have adequate electric power. A 15 AMP, 120V/60Hz circuit is required. Additional appliances on the same circuit as this appliance may exceed the current rating of that circuit. Please dedicated circuit is preferred to prevent circuit breaker trips or fuse failure.

Prepare the outlet close to the right side of appliance. **Make sure** the outlet is in good condition and the plug must be plugged tightly in the outlet.




The appliance listed will be is supported by the bottom framing. Make sure the bottom framing is solid and level. Leave some gap behind the right stud for electrical supply.

4.A2) Fix the plasterboard to edge of the framed opening. Allow 3/4" (19mm) of the wood at two sides exposed for fixing the brackets. If you want to stick ledge stone on plasterboard, you would add one more wood on each side what has same thickness as your ledger stone.



4.A3) Fix the fixing brackets at both sides by 6pcs Bolt (CC) as shown.

Note: The hook hole of the fixing bracket is front.




Electrical Connection

WARNING: Do not attempt to wire your own new outlets or circuits. To reduce the risk of fire, electric shock or injury to persons, the hard wiring must be supplied with a qualified electrician.

WARNING: Ensure that the circuit on which the fireplace is to be installed has the power cut off at the service panel until installation is complete.

The fireplace is packaged with a three prong plug installed for plug-in convenience. Hard wiring the fireplace is also an option for any installation.

- a. Plug in (the power cord is 6ft(1.8m) long and on the right of the fireplace, you may run the power cord out of the framed wall opening to an existing outlet or install an outlet on a nearby wall stud within the wall). If the cord is not long enough to reach the outlet, a rounded extension cord minimum AWG No. 14 wiring and rated to a minimum or 1875 watts may be used.
- b. Hard wire the fireplace (recommended). A qualified electrician may remove the cord connection, and wire the appliance directly to the house hold wiring. The appliance must be electrically connected and grounded in accordance with local codes.



5. OPERATING INSTRUCTIONS

Electrical Supply Circuit Requirements

- Plan the location of the appliance so that it will have adequate electric power. A 15
 AMP, 60Hz circuit is required for 120V installation. The appliance should ideally be
 located close to a suitable main socket to enable power connection.
- The power cord is 6ft long and locates on the right side of the unit. Avoid the use of an extension cord as it may overheat and cause a risk of fire. However, if an extension cord MUST be used, the cord must be No. 14AWG minimum size and rated not less than 1,875 watts. The extension cord must be a 3-prong cord with grounding type plug and cord connection. and it should not be longer than 7ft and 10 31/64".
- Always make sure the outlet is in good condition and the plug is not loose. NEVER
 exceed the maximum amperage of the circuit.

NOTE:

- This model can **NOT** be hard wired.
- THE PLUG MUST BE PLUGGED VERY TIGHTLY. DO NOT plug other appliances on to the same circuit.





5a.A) Power:

- Push button to turn ON or turn OFF.
- It is invalid to child lock state.
- The POWER button supplies power to all the features of the electric insert. This button must be ON for any of the features to work properly.
 - When the fireplace is first turned on, the Flame is Amber, the Carbon Light is Amber, the heater default OFF.
 - When OFF all current settings will be restored then restored at the next power ON (except Timer). Unplug the unit will reset the setting to factory default.

5a.B) Flame:

- This button controls the brightness/color of flame.
- It is invalid to OFF or child lock state.
- When the first time push simulated flame effect that the flame brightness is on highest setting and the flame with Amber, the digital display screen will be shown F01.

- Press and hold the flame button and enter the flame brightness adjustment. The flame button for flashes, There are 5 levels of flame brightness. display screen will be shown b5-b1-b2-b3-b4, No operation within 10 seconds to exit the brightness adjustment mode.
- After switching the flame mode, the flame brightness returns to the brightest, and the flame brightness is not saved after the device is in standby.

5a.C) Carbon Light:

- Press to Activate the back Carbon light function, the system will set the Amber spot light, the digital display screen will be shown H03.
- It is invalid to OFF or child lock state.

5a.D) Flame Speed:

- This button controls the Flames Speed of flame.
- It is invalid to OFF / Flames OFF / Child lock state.
- Press to activate the flame speed function, the system will set the S3, the digital display screen will shown S3.
- There are 5 levels of the flame speed, when you press this button, the digital display screen will show corresponding letter as S1 to S5.

5a.E) Heater:

Press to start the heating function, and the system will set the temperature to 95°F/35°C,the digital display screen will be shown 95°For 35°C.

It is invalid to OFF or child lock state.

• There are 10 adjustable heat levels:

- You can switch the temperature display from Fahrenheit to Celsius by pressing the Heater button for approximately 5 seconds. The system the default Fahrenheit.
- When the heater is on, once turn off the flame mode and the Carbon mode simultaneously, the carbon is slightly bright, the digital display screen will display the setting temperature.

5a.F) Flame Sound:

- This button controls the Flames Sound, short press this key to cycle through.
- ullet There are 4 levels of flame sound. display screen will be shown "— \equiv \equiv OFF".

5a.G) Child Lock:Combination keys

When the device is on, press **FLAME SOUND** button and **CARBON LIGHT** button for 3 seconds to activate or deactivate the Child Lock Function. When the Child Lock is on, the digital display screen will display "- - -".

NOTE:After the child lock is turned on, you can use the remote control to turn off,The other keys do not work.

5a.H) Factory reset:Combination keys

The device is powered on and in standby, Press FLAME SOUND button and FLAME SPEED button 3S, Restore factory settings, The flashes slowly to display screen "888".

5a.l) Power-on mode: Combination keys

The device is powered on and in standby, Press FLAME SOUND button and POWER button 3S On/Off Power-on mode.

The power-on mode is set successfully: the screen display flashes "888" for 3 seconds, The power-on mode is successfully closed: "III" for 3 seconds.

5a.J) WIFI configuration connection:Combination keys NOTE:Choose according to product.

The device is powered on and in standby, Press and hold the switch for 5S to enter the WIFI configuration hot spot, the display screen "SL" flashing quickly.

5a.K) Display Screen:

The digital display will show the numbers for the corresponding function of the corresponding operation.

The screen flickers during setting operation, exits the setting mode after 10 seconds of no operation, and turns off the screen after another 10 seconds to enter standby.

5b. Remote Control


The remote control can be used up to 13 feet (4 meters) away from the heater, so long as there are no obstructions between the remote control and the heater. the remote can control all the settings as the control panel does.

REMOTE CONTROL BATTERIES

Press and slide the battery cover on the rear of the remote and remove the cover. Insert two new AAA 1.5V batteries into the battery compartment. Ensure that the polarity is correct. Batteries are not included in the package due to safety during transportation.

Note: Do not mix old and new batteries together in the remote.Do not mix alkaline, standard (carbon-zinc), or rechargeable (NiCad, NiMh, etc.) batteries together.

Buttons on the Remote Control have the same functions as those on the Control Panel except Timer\Child Lock\FLAME BRIGHTNESS - \FLAME BRIGHTNESS+ \ UP \ DOWN.



5b.H) Timer:

Press to Activate TIMER feature ON and OFF.

It is invalid to OFF or child lock state.

- Press button you can set the turn off time from 0.5H to 12H interval, with 0.5H/1H/2H/3H/4H/5H/6H/7H/8H/9H/10H/11H/12H/OFF.
- Once the TIMER is on and the desired setting is reached, you may hear a long"BEEP" and the system will shut down.

5b.G) Child Lock:

When the device is on, press Child Lock button for activate or deactivate the Child Lock Function. When the Child Lock is on, the digital display screen will display "--- ",you can use the remote control to turn off,the other features are disabled.

5b.K) UP:

Coordinating with FLAME / CARBON LIGHT / HEATER / TIMER button, use this UP button to increase.

5b.M) DOWN:

Coordinating with FLAME / CARBON LIGHT / HEATER / TIMER button, use this Down button to decrease.

5b.IJ)FLAME BRIGHTNESS - / FLAME BRIGHTNESS +

These two keys can be used cyclically.

Temperature Limiting Control

This heater is equipped with a Temperature Limiting Control.

Should the heater reach an unsafe temperature, the heater will automatically turn OFF. **To reset:**

- Unplug the power cord from the outlet.
- Turn the Power Switch on the CONTROL PANEL to OFF. Wait at least 30 minutes.Lower electric firebox internal temperature.
- Inspect the fireplace to make sure no vents are blocked, or clogged with dust or lint. If they are, use a vacuum to clean the vent areas.
- With the Power Switch in the OFF position, plug the power cord back into the outlet.

If it switches off again, UNPLUG THE HEATER RIGHT AWAY!

Have the outlets, wiring, and breaker box inspected by a professional. Make necessary repairs before using the heater.

6. CARE AND MAINTENANCE



- ALWAYS turn the appliance OFF and unplug the power cord from the outlet before cleaning, performing maintenance, or moving this fireplace.
 Failure to do so could result in electric shock, fire, or personal injury.
- NEVER immerse in water or spray with water. Doing so could result in electric shock, fire, or personal injury.
- Risk of electric shock! DO NOT OPEN! Replace parts contact our customer service team for help first!

CLEANING

Metal:

- Buff using a soft cloth, slightly dampened with a citrus oil-based product.
- DO NOT use brass polish or household cleaners as these products will damage the metal trim.

Glass:

- Use a good quality glass cleaner and dry thoroughly with a paper towel or lint-free cloth.
- **NEVER** use abrasive cleansers, liquid sprays, or any cleaner that could scratch the surface.

Plastic:

Wipe gently with a slightly damp cloth and a mild solution of dish soap and warm water.

Vents:

- Use a vacuum or duster to remove dust and dirt from the appliance and vent areas.
- Clean the exterior of the fireplace with a slightly damp cloth or duster.

MAINTENANCE

Electrical and Moving Parts:

- The fan motors are lubricated at the factory and will not require lubrication.
- Electrical components are integrated in the fireplace and are Replace parts contact our customer service team for help first!

Storage:

Store appliance in a clean dry place when not in use.

Replacement parts:

- Use only replacement parts supplied by the manufacturer. Use of any other parts, or modifying the fireplace in any way, will void all warranties.
- Battery Replacement: two new AAA 1.5V batteries for the remote control.

 - 3) If there is no beep, the connectors on the PCB board might be loosen, please contact service team for a checking instruction.
 - 4) If there is a beep and the control panel can be used but the remote is not working, the remote is not working either close or far, please contact service team for help.
- 2. My old unit no longer works, it cannot power on.
 - 1) Check the power cord to see if it is good.
 - 2) If the power cord is good, check the wires behind the rocker switch to see if they are burned.
 - 3) If the wires are good, too, the PCB board might have malfunctioned and need to be replaced. Please contact service team for a replacement and instruction.
- 3. The heater does not work, it turns on for several seconds then shuts off itself.
 - 1) New product:
 - a. Turn the Heater to 99°F to see if the heater will work continuously.
